Demographics

There are currently 247 students enrolled; 83 seniors, 53 juniors, 52 sophomores, and 59 freshmen. When asked, students identify themselves as the following: American Native Indian (1%), Asian (5%), Black or African American (32%), Hispanic or Latino (10%), Multiracial (4%), and White/ Non-Hispanic (48%). Students in attendance come from a wide area of the St. Louis Metropolitan region including Illinois as well multiple countries throughout the world.

Curriculum

The school year consists of 2 semesters of 18 weeks (each with 9 week reporting periods). Credits and GPA are calculated each semester. During the COVID pandemic 2020-2021 school year students followed a block schedule with students given the opportunity to study in person or virtually. In the 2021-2022 school year Rosati-Kain resumes its regular six-day rotating modular schedule. All instruction is taking place in person.

Graduation Requirements

The minimum number of credits for graduation for all students is 28. The course distribution must meet the requirements of the Cognia, the State of Missouri, and the standards of the Archdiocese of St. Louis. The requirements are:

HISTORY

Originally, Rosati-Kain was established as two separate educational institutions named for Archbishops Joseph Rosati and John Joseph Kain, the first two Archbishops of St. Louis. The centers were run by the Sisters of Saint Joseph (Rosati Center) and School Sisters of Notre Dame (Kain Center). In the fall of 1911, the two centers combined to form one school, Rosati-Kain. Presently, Rosati-Kain educates students from throughout the St. Louis area and Illinois (representing 103 grade schools from 68 zip codes) as well as including international students from seven different countries. Located in the city's Central West End, Rosati-Kain serves young women who are diverse in religious, geographical, social, racial, and economic backgrounds. Faculty and staff work to enrich, cultivate, educate, and prepare all students to successfully pursue their current and future goals.
