- Ephesians 4:2-3



RACIAL EQUITY Resources AT ROSATI-KAIN

Over the last year—under the leadership of Dr. Goodwin and Principal McNamee, with the help of highly qualified alumnae, faculty, and staff—concerns about racial equity, discrimination, microaggressions, and current events created opportunities to begin dialogues and develop initiatives supporting Rosati-Kain's mission of being an inclusive and diverse community. A number of efforts were launched to address racial unrest and uncertainty during a pandemic. Those have included:

- a cultural competency pilot as part of the curriculum;
- professional development with Anjanette Clark to ensure the curriculum reflects the world and community we serve;
- listening sessions to hear the concerns of students and alumnae;
- Unity Lab Multiethnic Conversations (Lauren Drummond Littrel) with parents, faculty, and students; and
- the Healing Project (Erin Brennan and Ronda Smith), where girls formulate art, poems, and other creative expressions of identity.

The focus on building more diverse alumnae engagement is ongoing. One such developing program is the R-K Mentor Program. Alumnae have volunteered to be paired with a student or recent graduate.

Professional Development

On Monday, March 22, 2021, R-K Staff took part in a professional development day focused on culturally

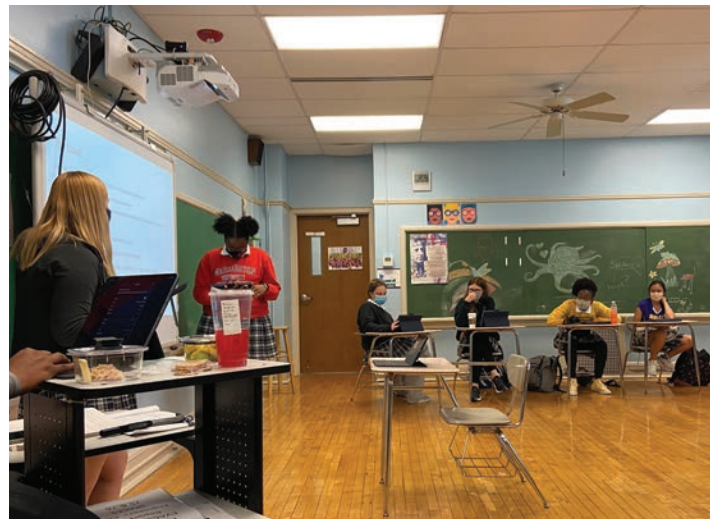
responsive learning. The work centered around the Equity Collaborative and outlined strategies to create learning experiences that embrace all students. The objectives for the day were to increase understanding of the culturally responsive learning space and explore ways to include culturally responsive strategies in daily lessons and activities. The morning concluded with work to combat microaggressions and how to become an upstander in tense situations.

There was great participation from the staff and the information on culturally responsive learning was well received. Anjanette Morrow Clark '83 continues her work as a school consultant this school year by offering professional development support to our faculty and staff.

Rosati-Kain's Completes Second Unity Lab

Rosati-Kain's first Unity Lab was facilitated in the fall of 2020 by Lauren Drummond Littrell '84. The Truth & Reconciliation committee built on the success of the first Unity Lab with a second program that took place in the spring of 2021. This opened up the opportunity for more students to participate.

The second Unity Lab started on Tuesday, March 23 and ran for four weeks. The ultimate goal of the Unity Labs program is to work towards racial reconciliation.

In addition to Lauren using her own ministry tools and sharing her personal experiences, the primary resource for the Unity Lab is the workbook entitled, *Multiethnic Conversations: An Eight Week Journey Toward Unity in Your Church* by Mark Deymaz and Oneya Fennell Okuwobi.

Also in March of 2021, we held our first Unity Lab conversation with student participants. This student Unity Lab ran for four weeks. All students were welcome to join Pastor Lauren Drummond Littrell '84 for a discussion on race, which focused on scripture, and was based on our lived experiences and the struggle for racial equity. Following the completion of this four-week program and the end of the school year, Lauren and Campus Minister Erin Brennan continue to offer support to our students while also collecting feedback.

A New Pilot Program

R-K faculty members, Campus Minister Erin Brennan and Diversity Club moderators Sean Ferguson and Mel Wilson Scurlock, worked hard in the spring of 2021 to pilot a cultural competency class for 9th graders this fall. Sophomores, juniors and seniors joined them in developing this pilot class.

The goal of the program is to create a cohesive diversity and inclusion focus for our school, in conjunction with efforts from Diversity Club, the ongoing Unity Labs, and alumnae-driven equity projects. The 9th grade class will become an important part of the R-K curriculum.

Throughout the pilot program, students were invited to provide feedback that facilitators will implement in the future class. The curriculum was written with school input by Jenny Truax, an author, artist, and social justice educator.

The Future

Looking ahead to the 2021-22 school year, Rosati-Kain will be participating in the Boniface Foundation Cultural Competency Project. This is a two-year project in which R-K will be in a cohort with three other private high schools working to improve cultural competency. This cultural competence program will be part of a multi-subject introductory course for 9th grade. Among the many skills students will develop while at Rosati-Kain, they will practice examining individual biases, systems of exclusion, and imagine a community based on equity and empowerment for all students. Inspiring work is being done in and outside of the classroom! Please keep our students, faculty, and staff in your prayers.

A TEACHER'S PERSPECTIVE FROM MRS. KAREN DAUES:

Lord, help me to remember that nothing will happen today that You and I together can't handle.

I pray this prayer a lot, but it was never so handy as in the middle of Spring Break 2020. March 17 was the day we resolved to teach virtually from home for two weeks while everything blew over—two weeks. Now, 17 months later, a look around will tell you it's certainly been a long two weeks!

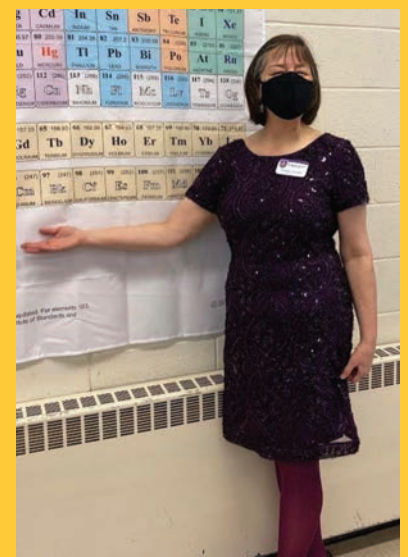
Looking back, there are a lot of things that provide fruitful opportunities for reflection and re-evaluation. For example, I am much less afraid to try out new digital technologies. Being suddenly chunked into the deep end of teaching from home, I quickly learned not only how to Zoom, but also how to assess which tech tools were the most useful during the shutdown. We live in a stunning age of technology and there are some very clever people out there delivering it. I decided to deliver the bulk of my instruction in an asynchronous format to give my students the ability to prioritize what needed to be done when. In keeping with the R-K tradition of forming strong, resilient young women, I hoped I was providing them opportunities to engage with the content while still dealing with all of the other cataclysmic changes going on internally and externally around them. Doing my best to keep all possible lines of communication open to them without stressing them out too much was the goal. The hardest part was not being able to see them every day to assure them it would all be okay.

Of course, because this was all going to play itself out over the summer, I neglected to go back and investigate those other tools in case I might need them for the fall semester. Oops.

Fast forward to August and we were back in person! Well, sort of. This time, God and I got to handle teaching both in person instruction in as sterile an environment as a school building can be while also teaching about one-third of the students 100% virtually. For better or worse, I decided to stick with asynchronous for the

virtual learners as I couldn't bear to think of them potentially being glued to their iPads for four hours straight on any given day. Surprisingly, I knew I could only do what I could do and that became very freeing for me. I did my best to keep my students, my colleagues, and myself safe according to the various research that steadily unfolded. I tried my best to be as upbeat as possible and clung tightly to the traditional events and activities that we were able to adapt and enjoy. October Day was amazing. All school Mass in the Cathedral was a real gift. Best of all, God saw fit to deliver the sweetest group of sophomores it has ever been my pleasure to teach. I really thanked God every day for the privilege of being with these awesome young people through this challenging experience.

Once again, it's time to gird our loins for the back-to-school extravaganza of the new school year. Wait, we're still wearing masks? Oh well, there are so many things we are now able to do that we couldn't do last year, and

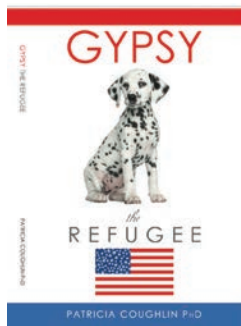

Alumna SPOTLIGHT

Pam Anderson Greenberg, '74



Pam Anderson Greenberg '74 lost her son Justin six years ago, when he was just 27-years-old, to an accidental heroin overdose. "The three most dangerous words you can say or think are, 'Not my child.' That's what I did with my son," said Pam.

Following such a tragic loss, Pam was looking for an outlet and the support groups weren't working, "I wanted to get in front of people and talk to parents," to provide them with the knowledge she never had. Thanks to a friend's suggestion, Pam connected with a local St. Louisan and author of *Suburban Junkie* (a book she recommends all parents read) Jude Hassan. From there *Addiction is Real* was formed, bit by bit, starting in 2015. Their mission is to provide parents with tools for a proactive approach in discussing the dangers of substance abuse with their children, as well as recognize signs of risky behavior.

Addiction is Real started with a trailer—the nonprofit organization would set up a teen's bedroom in the trailer and go to different schools, allowing parents to walk through the bedroom to see what they could find. The room would contain more than 70 things that should concern a parent, yet far too many went unnoticed. From there the group would go over signs, symptoms, and statistics and take questions and comments. "In plain view – an initiative to help you spot signs of risky behavior – an exhibit for adults. It's really something to experience, especially as parents," said Pam, "The stuff that's right in these rooms, right in front of our faces ... Hopefully we can make this experience happen at Rosati."

When COVID hit, *Addiction is Real* no longer had the option to go to schools, so they created the film *Don't Wait*, winner of two Telly Awards. Now the group has been able to share their message beyond St. Louis, with requests as far away as California and New York. "We're still in the midst of changing and evolving, strategizing how we can reach different groups," said Pam.

Throughout COVID, there's been an increase in suicide and overdosing in teens. "They're self medicating. Depression went through the roof during COVID," said Pam. "You know where kids start? In their parents' medicine cabinet. After they go through friends and family, they go to the streets."

Pam and Becky Calcaterra Braddock '74 are lifelong friends who met at Rosati-Kain. "You can't help but share the passion when you hear Pam tell her story," said Becky. She decided to reach out to the Rosati-Kain Class of 1974 to ask for donations. "It was amazing to me to hear from Pam about the lack of resources. It's important for our parents to see and for the students to have this education."

The Class of '74 stepped up and made it possible to bring *Don't Wait* to Rosati-Kain for students to watch. Then they went a step further and decided to donate a class ring to a deserving R-K junior in Pam's name. Becky never shared these details with Pam; she wanted it to be a surprise.

Rosati-Kain sent Becky a letter recognizing the donations made to the school. Becky then took that letter and balloons to Pam. "I don't know that I've ever been so touched by something. I just stood on my front porch crying," said Pam, "Becky is always thinking of others, the kindest person I know."

"It's hard not to share in her passion," said Becky, "She's taken her son's life and made it more meaningful. Even if this reaches one person, that's a huge accomplishment."

"I want to extend my deepest gratitude to the Class of '74 for making this possible for Rosati-Kain," said Pam. "Every parent needs to hear this whether they think they do or not. I wish it had been around when I was a young parent." Pam stresses that *Addiction is Real* simply wants parents and teachers to be aware of the resources and know that there's help out there. "You've got to talk to your children. We recommend talking to them in preschool and we will show you the tips on how to start the conversation. Start young

Sister Nancy Marie Becker, SSND '57

Sister Nancy Marie Becker was born in St. Louis and professed her first vows in 1959. She devoted her earliest years to teaching Catholic grade school students around St. Louis, serving at All Souls, St. Gabriel the Archangel, and St. Barbara. Following short stints in Burlington, Iowa and Westphalia, Missouri, Sister Nancy returned to St. Louis as a teacher and administrator at Notre Dame Elementary and Holy Angels in East St. Louis, Illinois. Throughout the 1980s and 1990s, she devoted herself to high school campus ministry, serving at Bishop DuBourg and Rosary High School, both in St. Louis. From 1993-2005, Sister Nancy also served as director of vocations for the St. Louis Province. She has since devoted her full-time ministry as coordinator of the Maria Center in St. Louis.

Meet Our Therapy Dog: **EDGE**

She was worth the wait. Please allow us to formally introduce one of the newest members of Rosati-Kain High School, our new therapy dog, a Labradoodle named Edge! Five years ago, we joined a waiting list to be one of the first in our area to bring this resource to our school community. As luck would have it, our Director of School Counseling Jamie Burke, got the call in the summer of 2020. Who could've predicted that we'd finally get our therapy dog the year that we needed her most? Edge has been a true blessing to the Kougar community since she started in August of 2020, providing much needed support in a year unlike any other.

Edge is a professionally trained therapy dog. She comes to us from CARES Inc., an organization based in Concordia, Kansas that trains professional therapy and assistance dogs. Edge's skillset is vast and applicable to classroom settings and individual therapy sessions. Professional therapy dogs who are used in a school setting like Edge have shown positive outcomes, including stress reduction and improved attendance and academic performance.

"Edge is very outgoing and has a significant sense of feeling," said Jamie Burke, who adopted Edge to provide full time care in and out of school, "Whether someone is anxious or angry, Edge is there as a calming force."

Wellness Counselor, Mary Wald, often uses Edge in students' personal therapy sessions. She says that Edge's presence helps students open up, making it easier for them to talk and work through their feelings. Jamie adds, "If the student is having a lot of difficulty opening up about a situation, it's made it helpful for them."

Of course, our Student Support Services department wants to be mindful of students who may not enjoy having a dog around. That's why Ceri Brush's Eagle Scout project, a hand-built large crate for Edge, has been a great addition. "We wanted to have a place where we could have her safely confined if we had a student who is uncomfortable," says Jamie.

Jamie says it's clear how much Edge is making a difference in our community, especially during a pandemic, "I have already this year had staff members and students visibly upset, and she will go and sit right next to that person and be a calming, grounding force," she said. "We're beginning to see the impact she's going to make. If nothing else, we see the morale it brings to the school. Watching her when someone is in distress, that's when you know she's a professional therapy dog."

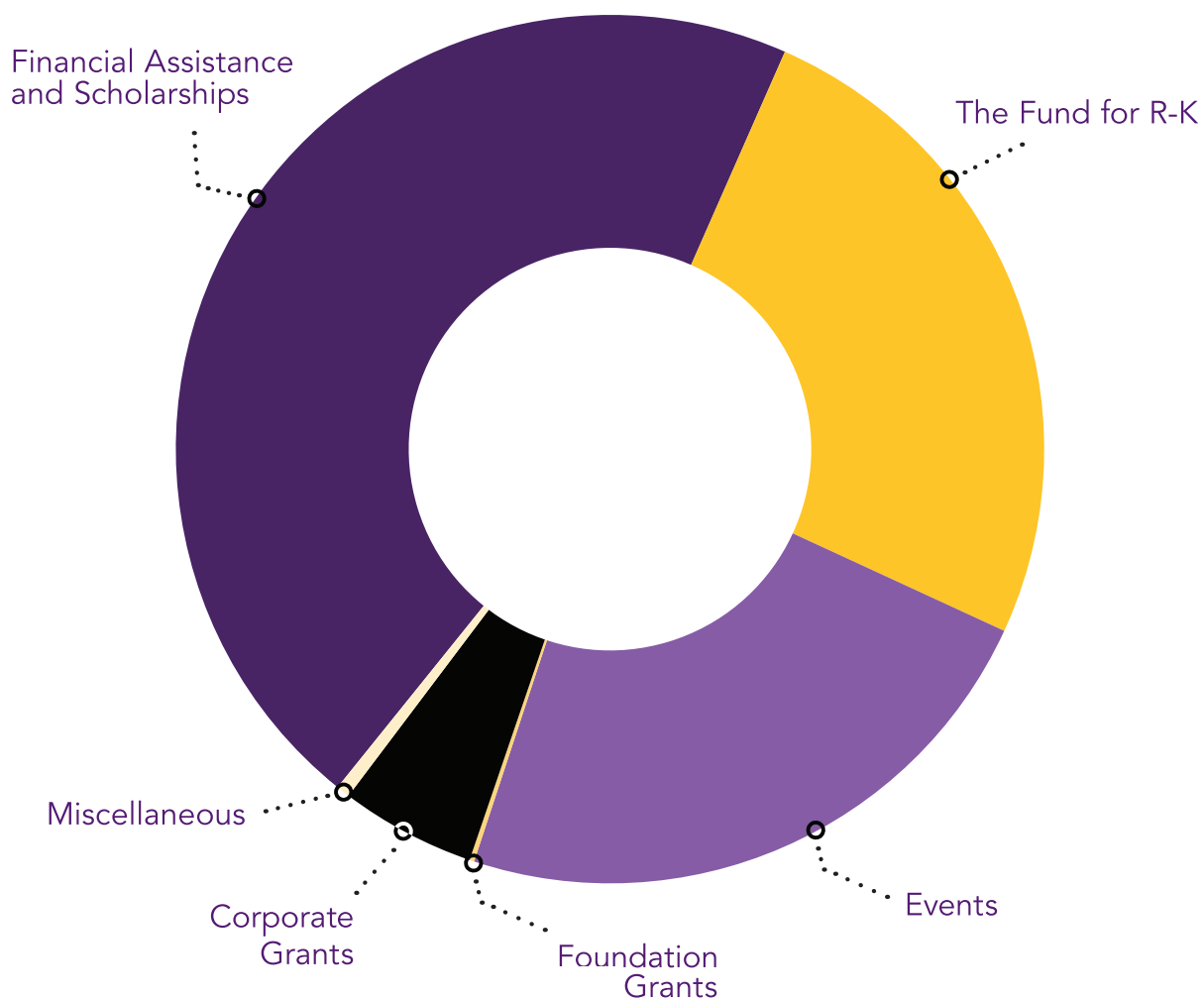

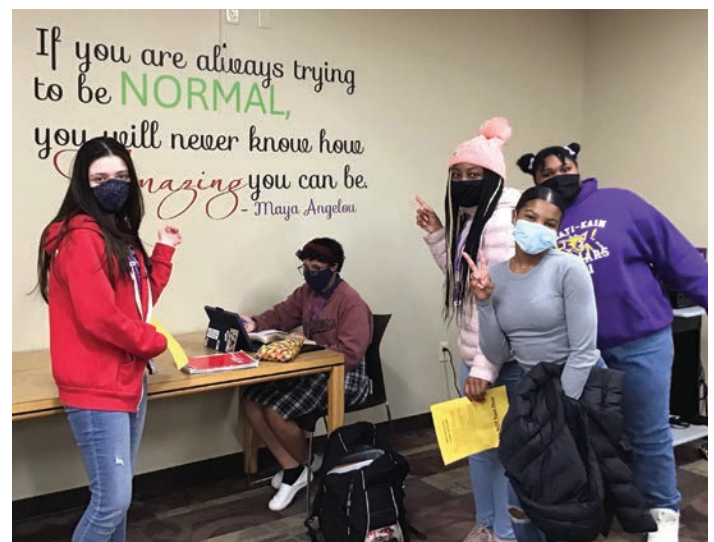
