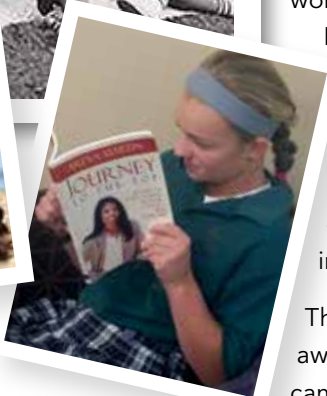

Areva (Bell) Martin, '80 Remembers

AN INCREDIBLE INSTITUTION



Throughout it all—non-profits, law offices, publishing, political campaigns, and newsrooms—Areva holds mentorship in the highest of regards.

Areva attended Harvard Law School after graduating from the University of Chicago. While in Chicago, she entered the arena of political activism, working on the mayoral campaign for Harold Washington, who was the first African-American mayor candidate in Chicago. While she loved the allure of politics, Areva found herself more drawn to a career where she could have an impact on the world around her.

Throughout it all—non-profits, law offices, publishing, political campaigns, and newsrooms—Areva holds mentorship in the highest of regards. In her book, she attempts to mentor all women on the lessons she learned in her struggles to become a self-made woman. Sophomore Janie McCarthy read *Journey to the Top* over the summer, and recounts Areva's lesson that one should either lead or get out of the way. McCarthy says, "The book really made me want to lead right away. I am anxious to use all of the tips I learned in it to start my own career one day." McCarthy has also taken Areva's concept of self promotion to heart and has begun using it in her relevant interactions.

Areva also frequently finds herself mentoring others one-one-one when their paths cross. She credits Rosati-Kain's Big Sister-Little Sister relationships with initially teaching her the significance of mentorship. This program planted in her the seeds of recognizing the importance of reaching back along your path to provide assistance and to help those who need it.

Areva fondly remembers Rosati-Kain as "an incredible institution" that encouraged her to think independently and instilled in her self-esteem, pride, and confidence: all of which she says helped make her into the woman she is today. She recognizes the sacrifices her family made to provide her with a Rosati-Kain education, and she hopes current students take full advantage of the opportunity to grow at Rosati-Kain. Above all else, she hopes students will develop an appreciation and fondness for Rosati-Kain, realize how special this opportunity is, and cherish the memories they are making.

Today, more often than not, you can find Areva (Bell) Martin, '80, on CNN, MSNBC, or HLN doing what she is most passionate about: providing a voice for communities who are often voiceless and marginalized. Before she became a nationally recognized political commentator, Areva founded a non-profit to help individuals with special needs, started her own law firm, and wrote a book (*Journey to the Top*) encouraging women to become comfortable with branding and marketing themselves to achieve greater career success.

Nancy Mueller, '78

NURTURING STUDENTS

Upon graduation from Rosati-Kain in 1978, Nancy attended St. Louis University on a basketball scholarship. She chose her degree from her love of basketball. "Teaching, for me," she explains, "was a way to coach, a natural progression. As a teacher, you are here for the kids. With them and for them."

This August, Nancy began her 31st year of teaching at Rosati-Kain. With three decades of dedication to R-K students, it is no wonder that Nancy has taught almost every math class available. This school year, you can find her teaching Accounting, Algebra 1, Algebra 2, and Personal Finance. Nancy humbly admits, "It's been a great 30 plus years, but I'm not out to beat anyone," a clear reference to other R-K legends such as Barry O'Keeffe (a 45 year veteran) and Sr. Judith Schulte, CSJ (with 49 years of dedicated service).

However, math is not the only way Nancy has nurtured R-K students over the years. She has also been a dedicated coach. Nancy has racked up a cumulative coaching total of 62 years: 22 with basketball, 18 with volleyball, 12 years with softball, and 10 years with track. Between teaching and coaching, Nancy's efforts with and for R-K students is evident when former students speak about her. Maya Warren, '03, remembers algebra class, feeling intimidated, "as Ms. Mueller meant business!" It did not take long, though, for Maya to

appreciate "her great sense of humor and her true love for teaching!" Maya remembers Nancy fondly, saying, "She really just wants the best for her students and gives her best in return."

Nancy is not just a teacher and a coach, however; she is also an innovator. Twenty-six years ago, she and then-fellow math instructor, Sr. Joan Andert, SSND, conceived of the 7th grade math contest for girls. "We created it so we could celebrate girls being successful in math," Nancy reminisces. "We saw it as an opportunity for them and for Rosati as well." And the trivia night that everyone enjoys? That is Nancy's addition to Rosati-Kain as well. Originally envisioned as an alumnae fundraiser, trivia night has evolved as an event that benefits the seniors and helps defray the costs of prom, something for which every senior is grateful.

Nancy does not just travel the hallways of Rosati-Kain; she travels the world with R-K students in tow. In 1993, Nancy took the first group of students abroad, exploring London and Paris. Since then, she has taken groups all over Europe and has also visited China, Costa Rica and Belize. The summer of 2016 will find Nancy and R-K students in Italy. Like every good educator, Nancy knows her own education is always ongoing. "Even teachers learn on trips," she quips

about travelling with a group of teenage girls.

As a volunteer, Nancy's most recent experience was organizing and managing two move days to facilitate the renovation of and settling into Rosati-Kain's new building. Logistically, Nancy coordinated 80 volunteers who moved nearly 3,000 books and countless pieces of furniture.

Nancy has also been "a second set of hands" to Theresa Everson's summer service week. During this week, 12 to 15 students spend a week working to better their world either at R-K or at camps for under-privileged youth. Nancy is glad that she and Theresa were able to "open the girls' eyes to the needs of people around them."

Yes, Nancy appears to have a full plate, but her perspective is inspiring. "Students always help energize me after many years of teaching, travel, service, and coaching," says Nancy. "I enjoy seeing students see things for the first time. Whatever we are doing, it is probably a new experience for them and I always remember that—it may be old for me, but it is new to them. It brings me joy."

Thank you, Nancy, for all the joy you bring to R-K.

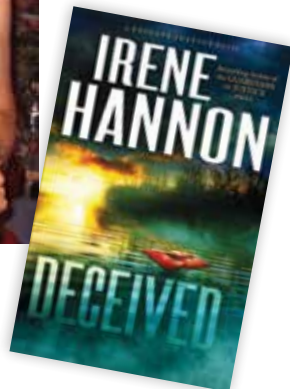

Legacy Reunion R-K Voices

Rosati-Kain Students Embrace a **CULTURE of SERVICE**

There are many ways that R-K students are encouraged to live as women of faith with the call to service. This includes the juniors, who spend a week outside of the classroom in service to the larger community. This past spring, the class of 2016 volunteered at 39 different locations throughout the St. Louis area. These service sites included schools, nursing homes, pediatric specialty hospitals, general hospitals, day care centers, and crisis nurseries.

Rosati-Kain students do not just serve during the school-sanctioned week of service. They also search out unexpected opportunities to serve

others throughout the year. In the 2014-2015 school year, the R-K community accrued countless hours of selfless work for the betterment of the St. Louis region. As a group, the junior varsity and varsity basketball teams and cheerleaders made welcome cards for St. Martha's Hall, an emergency shelter for abused women and children. The Service Club painted fences at a rescue ranch for horses.

Making a difference through service is an important part of each R-K girl's life. Here are some examples of the involvement of some of our students throughout the past school year.

As **Jackie Bova**, Rosati-Kain's Campus Minister, explains, "through their service experiences, our students grow in an understanding of themselves and others. We are confident these young women will go out into the world with hearts of service." **Who will you serve today?**



Abby Kenyon, '16, recently helped organize Rosati-Kain's first-ever hair drive to benefit the group Children with Hair Loss, which provides wigs for children. During the spring pep rally, Kenyon and 33 other students donated at least 8

inches of hair each. Kenyon organized the entire event, from proposing the concept to securing hairstylists to rallying students to participate. Four licensed stylists volunteered their time, including Amy Naumann, mother of Mary, '15, and Sara, '18. Kenyon explains that "this was my first real experience in organizing a service event like this, and it's an opportunity I'm not sure I would have gotten anywhere else."



Lis Emerson, '16, grew up on a 20-acre farm which provided a foster home for 24 Huskies. Although they have since moved, Emerson and her family are still very active in the adoption business. As Emerson points out, "those Huskies taught me

compassion, patience, and a passion for animals I will never lose." These early life lessons have made Emerson a passionate volunteer and have shaped the young woman she has become.



Sara Naumann, '18, has served for three years at vacation Bible school at her parish, St. Ferdinand, and is the current music director for their week-long camp. In the mornings, she taught songs and dances to the campers. Naumann

then took pictures of the students performing and put together a slideshow for the last day of camp. Camp "was a very rewarding experience" for Naumann, who "can't wait until [the] summer when I get to help again."



A trip to the Pro-Life March in Washington, D.C. resonated with **Daniella Duban, '18**. As she describes it, "the entire journey opened up my eyes. It was amazing to see thousands of people supporting one cause and one effort. Overall, the

Pro-Life March was an enlightening event, and I hope to go on the life-changing experience next winter." This experience also propelled Duban to find opportunities to serve closer to home. She volunteers at a veterans' home, enjoying the opportunity to "brighten up someone's day" by sacrificing a small portion of her time.



Anjane Kendall, '18, and her mother, Angela Kendall, shared a very special service experience. They were approached by an elderly man who said he needed help with his wife, who was dying of cancer. When they reached his house, the women stayed

for approximately six hours attending to the woman's personal needs. Kendall learned that "you never know when you might need the help of someone else." She now recognizes the importance of "always treat[ing] people you meet in your life the way that you want to be treated" and will carry this lesson with her for the rest of her life.



Emily Cataldo, '16, spent quality time volunteering in Washington, MO. Along with her youth group at Rural Parish Workers of Christ the King, Cataldo painted a nursery. She says, "I've been blessed to have service in my life in countless ways. In

every instance, I learned something important: the act of service creates a ripple effect and touches many lives." Like many others at R-K, Cataldo's life has been enriched through her service in ways she never expected.

When Rosati-Kain asked me to write an article explaining why I contribute to the school, the first line of Elizabeth Barrett Browning’s beloved poem flashed through my mind.

There’s just one problem. In this short space, it would be impossible to list all the ways I love Rosati.

But I can sum them up in one word.

Gratitude.

Back in my student days, I was grateful for the exceptional faculty members, who treated each of us as unique individuals capable of great things. Who encouraged us to stretch, and in so doing taught us never to put limits on ourselves. Who challenged us, expected nothing less than excellence, and instilled in us a desire to soar.

But while I appreciated Rosati during my teens, only in hindsight did I understand the true value of the education I received during the four most influential and formative years of my life.

Rosati taught me more than English and algebra and history. It taught me to be a seeker. It taught me the value of perseverance and the satisfaction of a challenge well met. It taught me to be open to new experiences, imbued me with an insatiable curiosity, and instilled in me the belief that it’s okay to march to the beat of a different drummer.

On a recent visit to R-K, I came upon a wooden bench where I had often sat as a student. In a flash, the years melted away and all the sweet memories flooded back.

I sat again, touching the wood worn smooth by countless uniform skirts, grateful that R-K continues to offer new generations of young women a vibrant Catholic education. I don’t have

a daughter, but if I did I would have followed the example of Wendy at the end of Peter Pan. Though she had grown up and could no longer return to Neverland, she sent her daughter off to experience her own magical, transforming adventure—as I would have sent mine to R-K.

Many years have passed since my student days at Rosati, but every time I return I feel the same magic and spirit. And whenever I meet current students, or read about the accomplishments of fellow alums, I’m reassured that the school is superlatively fulfilling its mission to cultivate the individuality, faith, talent, and aspirations of young women who will lead and serve the world.

More than 150 years ago, Walden Pond’s most famous resident wrote that he didn’t want to go through life only to discover, at the end, that he hadn’t lived.

It seems to me that teaching its students to live—in the fullest sense of the word—is the highest goal to which a school can aspire. That’s what Rosati did for me. The lessons I learned at R-K continue to influence me every day of my life—and I can think of no better legacy for a school to offer its students.

That’s why I give.

Building Update:

A STUDENT PERSPECTIVE

What does the new addition mean to us, as Rosati-Kain students? Well, between the new chemistry lab, huge third level incubator space, sophisticated learning commons, and amazing outdoor area, we are able to learn and interact with one another in comfortable and accommodating environments. The new addition also brought along extra hallway space, an enormous stairwell, a new media

center, and a very useful elevator. Each of these additions have made life at Rosati-Kain a whole lot easier.

The new and improved chemistry lab is an impressive sight to see. It stands tall in comparison to the previous year's chemistry room. The new lab provides us with sufficient learning space. When conducting labs and experiments in class, we have space and new technology to work with. The new chemistry room is also

well equipped with all of the tools we need to accomplish those experiments.

Another great aspect of the addition is the third level incubator space. This enormous room is great for having class meetings. For example, the junior class has used this space so far to talk about junior rings, discuss PSAT testing, listen to important speakers, and go over other important subjects which affect the junior class as a whole. 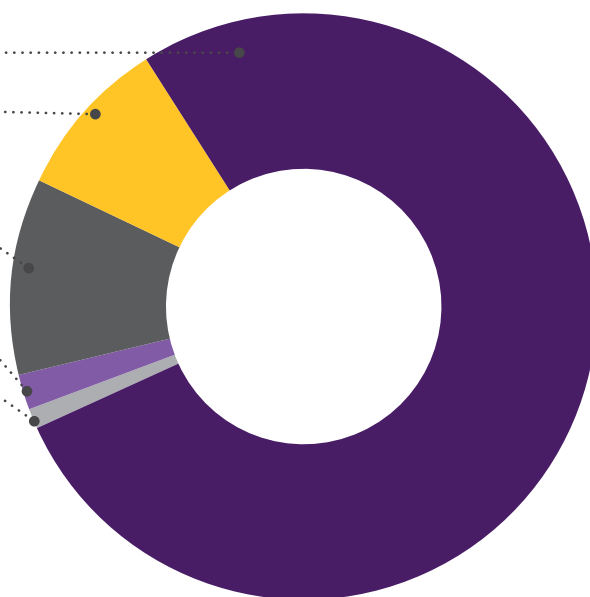

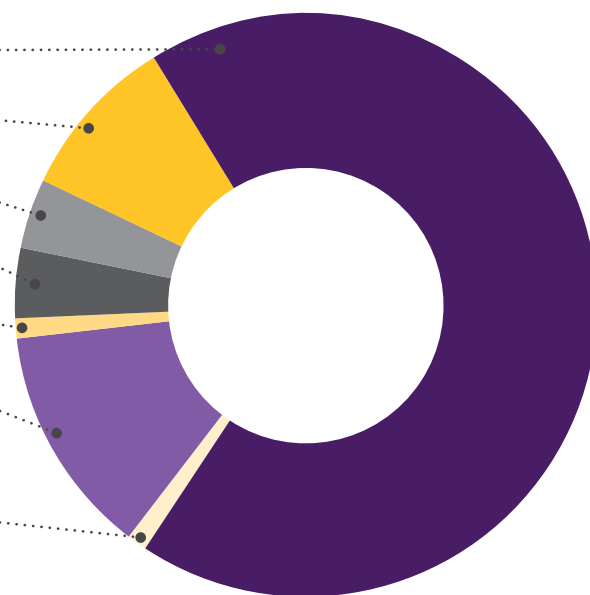
